CHAIR'S REPORT

The 2021/22 year records more milestones in the Youth Inspire journey. Through the He Poutama Rangatahi initiative we were able to provide individualised intensive support to over 35 rangatahi building skills and confidence, gaining qualifications, work experience and creating opportunities for sustainable employment. Along with the continued work with rangatahi through our other funding streams, the Youth Inspire team have shown that they are dedicated to changing the lives of our young people.

Our Road Ready Rangatahi Driving School has also continued to build on its success, offering free access to Learner, Restricted and Full driver licence programmes.

We would like to thank our funders who continue to invest in us to transition rangatahi into employment, training and education through our programmes and pastoral care. The Ministry of Social Development and the Ministry of Education – Pacific Education Support Fund has provided funding to run our Youth Employability Programmes. Waka Kotahi's commitment to seeing more young people get their driver licence has helped over 170 youth. Hutt City Council – Mouri Ora Fund meant we could work with youth in Wainuiomata and the Nikau Foundation, Bear Trust and COGS have supported our work – thank you all for your investment in our mahi.

WHAT WE DO

Youth Inspire changes the lives of rangatahi by providing pathways to employment, education, and training.

We base ourselves in the heart of communities in Lower Hutt where we're needed the most. Our services are accessible, action-based, and inclusive of diversity.

Youth Employability Programme

We teach essential employability skills. Our youth gain qualifications like First Aid and Barista certification as well as building confidence and resilience. Other workshops that build on these skills include budgeting, interview skills, CV and cover letter writing. Our goal is to transition our young people into a job or education.

Health & Wellbeing

Our team of Youth Advisors provide wraparound support and ensure our young people have housing, food, clothing, drug and alcohol support.

Driving School

Getting a driver licence is prohibitively expensive for many of our whānau but essential to get to get a job. With the help of community volunteers, our driving school enables rangatahi to become road ready.

We place many rangatahi into direct employment opportunities with our partners. We provide in-work support and on-going pastoral care.
